

AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 30 OF THE ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR ACT 2003

What This Means

I have received a number of complaints from residents in Eastbourne concerning anti-social behaviour caused by a minority of individuals. The types of unacceptable acts being committed are:

- Vandalism
- Drunkenness
- Assaults
- Anti social behaviour
- Public disorder

The order is in force in the area enclosed by the B2103 from Silverdale Road to Channel View Road, extending from the low-water mark to the northernmost extent of the carriageway, and including the pier; the area encompassed within the boundary formed by the B2103 at its junction with Devonshire Place, South Street into Gildredge Road, Terminus Road into Upperton Road, Enys Road, Eversfield Road, Upper Avenue, and Cavendish Place to the Pier; and the parkland area of Gildredge Park for dispersal.

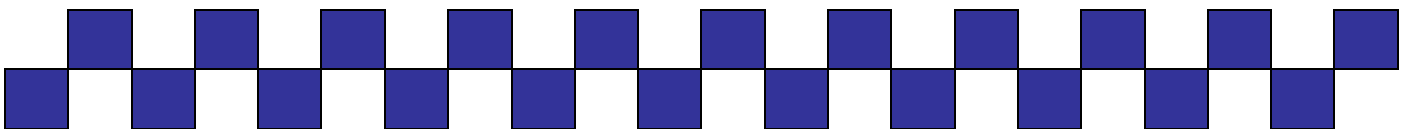
A police officer can, if the presence or behaviour of two or more persons has resulted, or is likely to result in the public being intimidated, harassed, alarmed or distressed,

- Tell the group to disperse
- Require individuals who do not live there to leave
- Direct persons, who do not live there, not to return for up to 24 hours.

Anyone who does not follow this direction may be arrested.

People and law-abiding groups have nothing to fear from this power as long as they are behaving in an orderly, law abiding manner.
